As Freemasons we remember the adoption of the Declaration Of Independence as a part of the history of our Country and our Craft. It is our belief that those who forget, or treat it lightly, cannot be worthy of its rewards.

The old disputes which led up to the American Revolution are now faded and forgotten and we focus, with respect, on the forefathers who fought to make us what we are. Since those days of Revolution, America and Great Britain have joined hands in vast enterprises and fought side-by-side in wars for the liberation of mankind and the redemption of civilization. Many today, do not seem to understand the meanings and measures of our countries struggle for freedom.
